Dear SPRA members and residents,

As you know, St Peter's Church is a unique piece of history on our doorstep. A Grade II listed building, it's the last Georgian church built in London and people have been worshipping here since 1829.

But as I'm sure you're also aware, it's more than just a remarkable historic building. Today it has a growing and diverse congregation and it's the cornerstone of a vibrant community which delivers so much for our neighbourhood. As well as St Peter's School, the church provides pastoral care and support to many vulnerable people around us from this beautiful historic building.

Now, we've got a small favour to ask.

The ancient drainpipes are in desperate need of the repair. At the moment rainwater is pouring down the side of the building, damaging the brickwork and causing ugly damp patches to the beautiful interior. This is why we urgently need to raise £50,000 to repair these pipes.

Already the congregation and others have been so generous. We're now £10,000 short of our target, so, as you can see, we still have some way to go.

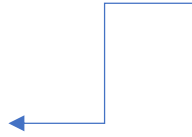

# DAMAGED RAIN WATER PIPES



## HOPPER HEADS

Not actually a hopper, as it has no 'back' – thus any water retained within is free to soak into brick work



## HOLE IN PIPE

For no reason we or the architects have been able to understand, except possibly it was done some time ago to allow removal of blockage. The hole allows water to spill out into the so-called hopper and thus onto the brickwork



## CRACKED PIPE

Pipe cracked all around and split in two when removed
